Location

Perched on the northern edge of the majestic Allegheny Mountains, 3,200 feet above sea level, the four-season Canaan Valley Resort and Conference Center boasts more than 6,000 acres of woodlands, meadows and rolling hills. Conference Overview and Objectives

We would like to invite you to the 2009 West Virginia Trauma Symposium to be held at Canaan Valley Resorts, Davis, WV. This conference is designed for trauma surgeons, general surgeons, emergency room physicians, nurses, mid-level providers and pre-hospital health care, coding specialists and health information professionals.
